<p style="text-align: center;"><b>READING:</b></p> <p>Choose a book or chapter of a book to read. Imagine you had the chance to meet and interview one or some of the characters. Write down questions that you would ask them. Try to think of at least 6.</p> <p>You may wish to think about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How they are feeling at a certain point.</li> <li>• Would they have done something differently?</li> <li>• Is there something that you really want to know?</li> </ul> <p>*Challenge – what do you think the answers of the character/s would be? Write these down too.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>SPELLING:</b></p> <p>Can you log onto Nessy Spelling and work on your individual targets?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Choose a way to further practise spelling your words.</p> <p>You may wish to try:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Speed Spelling – set yourself a time target (e.g. 30 seconds), choose a word, write it as many times as you can within your target time. Remember to check the spelling of all your attempts.</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>WRITING:</b></p> <p><u>Australian Tourism Challenge</u></p> <p>Can you promote Australia as a place for tourists to visit? You might want to create a poster, leaflet or advert for a magazine or newspaper. You might even want to write and record a script for a radio or TV advertisement.</p> <p>Think about the information that you will share about places and things of interest in Australia. This could be wonders of nature, animals, landmarks, entertainment or activities. How will you persuade people to visit?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>HEALTH AND WELL-BEING</b></p> <p>Visit “YouTube” and search for “Joe Wicks Kids Beginners Workout”.</p> <p>Choose a workout and complete one!</p> <p>Remember to take a break when you need one!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NUMERACY</b></p> <p><u>Times Tables</u></p> <p>Go on to Topmarks Maths – <b>Hit the Button</b> and practice any times tables you find tricky! See if you can beat your scores!</p> <p><u>Multiplication/Division</u></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>ART</b></p> <p><u>Aboriginal Art</u></p> <p>Aboriginal Art has survived thousands of years and is still used today. It contains symbols that were used to communicate. The colours used are those which can be seen in nature.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Try dot painting artwork.</li> </ul> <p>(If you don't have paints at home, use coloured pencils or pens).</p>

Can you create your own workout for someone to follow.

\*You could lead this activity for someone else at home or you could record your own instructional workout video.



1. Roll a dice to get digits to make a 2 or 3 digit number.
2. Roll the dice again to get a number to multiply the number you made in step 1 by.

E.g. I rolled 3 then 5 so I put them together to make 35. I then rolled a 6 so my sum becomes  $35 \times 6 = \underline{\quad}$ .

I can then also use these digits to complete  $35 \div 6 = \underline{\quad}$ .

Repeat the steps above to get lots of sums to practise.

\*If you have a pack of playing cards at home you could pick out numbered cards to give you digits for the sums.

- Using small coloured dots fill a drawing outline of an animal native to Australia. E.g. snake, kangaroo, frog, Lizard. . .
- Try using natural materials to create your art, for example, the end of a small broken branch or twig (please don't break a tree for these – look for ones that have naturally fallen off). Dip the end in paint and then apply to your paper.
- Remember to use colours you would find in nature. E.g. yellow, red, green, brown.

You could also try the tip of a cotton bud to apply the dots. TIP – make sure your outline is clear. You may wish to look online for some inspiration.
