OUTDOOR LEARNING:

BLOW SOME WINTER BUBBLES!

Blowing bubbles doesn't need to just be a summer activity. Grab some bubbles and go outside into the cold weather.

Blow some bubbles and look at them. If it is cold enough outside they will look different to how they would normally look!

As a note, this activity will only work for winter days that dip below freezing. It also works better if the bubble solution is cold before you head outside. So you might want to set the solution in a safe place outside in the morning and do this activity in the afternoon when the solution is cool.



READING:

Choose a book or a winter themed book and read it or ask an adult to read it to you. Choose a winter reading challenge from the list below.

Winter reading challenges:

- Listen to some festive or winter music while reading!
- Use a light or candle to read in the dark
- Read in your pyjamas (winter ones if you have them)
- Build a winter themed den and use it to read in

WRITING:

DESIGN YOUR OWN SNOWMAN

Design your own snowman character. Draw a detailed picture of it and then write a few words to describe it. Ask an adult for help if you need it.
