OUTDOOR LEARNING

Can you go outside for a winter walk and...

- Make a triangle out of twigs
- Make a rectangle out of twigs
- Find 3 acorns
- Find 8 twigs
- Find 4 leaves



WINTER BIRDS:

Help the birds by scooping out the inside of an orange and filling it with bird seed.

Watch your bird feeder and count how many birds visit it throughout the day.



WINTER WORD PROBLEMS:

- 1) Miss Livingstone baked 5 Christmas cookies. Mrs Park baked 2. How many cookies are there altogether?
- 2) There were 3 stockings hanging on the fireplace. The Grinch took 2 pieces of candy from each stocking. How many pieces of candy did the Grinch take in all?
- 3) Rudolph had 4 presents in his bag and Dasher had 6. How many presents do they have altogether?

Remember to use counters or items around the house to help you answer these questions.



OUTDOOR LEARNING:

Go on a winter scavenger hunt!

Make a tally chart of all of the items you find.

Try and find: pine cones, nuts, acorns, holly leaves, moss, leaves etc.

SNOW NUMBERS

If you are lucky enough to get a snowy day, write in the snow.

Add food colouring to a spray bottle filled with water, or use a paintbrush, and write some numbers or sums in the snow.

If you don't get a snow day...

Try and make some ICE BALLOONS! Fill some balloons with water, food colouring, glitter and sequins and then put them in the freezer. Once they are frozen, remove the balloon and have a look at them.

You could try adding food colouring or salt onto your ice balloons and investigate what happens to them.



BAUBLE SYMMETRY

Can you design a bauble and make it symmetrical? Try and make it as detailed as possible!
