

ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL RUIG AN BUN-SGOIL

Please note that the school day starts at 9am sharp and there is no supervision before this time. In extreme weather conditions (ie heavy rain, snow or high winds) if members of the Senior Leadership Team are available we will do our best to bring the children in to the Hub at 8.55am via the main school entrance. However, please note all P1 and P2 children can now enter the school at 8.55am via their main door on these days of extreme weather.

I would like to advise that, prior to 9 am, parents are responsible for their children and ask, if possible, for children not to be dropped off or arrive too early on extreme weather days and dark winter mornings.

As the mornings and afternoons are still fairly dark and visibility can be poor, we would like to ask parents to ensure that children coming to school on bikes or scooters have appropriate lights and reflective clothing to make them visible to other road users.

As we will be continuing to promote Outdoor Learning this term, please ensure your child comes to school suitably dressed to be able to access learning outdoors in all weather conditions.

School App for Parents It has been great to welcome all our new families to nursery. We have exciting opportunities ahead as we are working with Riverside Naturally to support growing and planting in our community. ABSENCE REPORTING PROCEDURE

Please call the school office on 01786 237933 to report your child's absence between 8.45-10.00am. If your child has not arrived at school and we have not heard from you, we aim to follow up any unexplained absences by phoning your contact numbers. It is important that the school have the most up to date contact numbers at all times. At times messages are left on phones if there is no response, so please take this into account when giving us contact numbers. This system has been set up to support you in keeping your child safe. If your child has been absent from school, please let us know the reason either in writing, by telephone or via email. All schools are required to provide The Scottish Government with attendance and absence statistics. In an effort to ensure that the information we pass on is as accurate as possible, we follow up any unexplained absences on a regular basis. An increasing amount of time is being spent following up unexplained absences. Any unexplained absences will be followed up by a member of our Senior Leadership Team. Those absences where we have not received a response will be recorded as unauthorised. I am sure that you will appreciate the need for accurate figures and thank you for your support and co-operation regarding this process.
