Absence Reporting



Please use the telephone number 01786 237933 to report your child's absence between 8.45-10.00am. If your child has not arrived at school and we have not heard from you, we aim to follow up any unexplained absences by phoning your contact numbers. It is important that the school has the most up to date contact numbers at all times. At times messages are left on phones if there is no response, so please take this into account when giving us contact numbers. This system has been set up to support you in keeping your child safe.

If your child has been absent from school, please let us know the reason either in writing, by telephone or via email. This is to help us record any absences with the correct codes for Scottish Government statistics.

All schools are required to provide The Scottish Government with attendance and absence statistics. In an effort to ensure that the information we pass on is as accurate as possible, we are required to follow up any unexplained absences on a regular basis. An increasing amount of time is being spent following up unexplained absences. Any unexplained absences will be followed up by a member of our Senior Leadership Team. Those absences where we have not received a response will be recorded as unauthorised. I am sure that you will appreciate the need for accurate figures

and thank you for your support and co-operation regarding this process.

Medicines



From time to time, there may be a need for your child to receive medication during the school day.

Any request to administer prescribed medication must be accompanied by clear, written, signed instructions from the parent/carer on "Parent/Carer Request for Administration of Prescribed Medication" form (available from the school office).

Where there is any change to the medication then updated instructions must be given to the school. All prescribed medication must be brought to the school office by a parent/carer.

All out of date and unclaimed medication is disposed of at the end of every school year, therefore if your child requires regular medication for any reason (e.g. asthma) you should bring in new medication and complete the relevant forms at the beginning of each session.

If you are unsure of any of these procedures, please contact the school office where staff will be only too pleased to help you.





Nursery Update



As we begin our new term we like to welcome our new families and returning families. It is great to see the children settle so well, thanks for your support through transitions and the sharing of information. We always have a big focus on relationships and over the last few weeks we have seen new friendships being built, children becoming confident seeking out adults and trying new experiences and learning new routines.

We have 3 Learning intentions that we are focusing on across the nursery in Health and Wellbeing. We are looking at ways we can share our needs and feelings. In numeracy and maths we are developing our understanding of numbers naming, recognising and identifying these. In communication we are developing our listening and talking skills.

The community is important to Riverside - this involves walks in the community, book bug sessions, Forest schools and we also have links with Riverside Naturally and Tree link which involves planting and growing opportunities.

We continue to use the wider school spaces to support extended learning such as the library, STEM classroom, Gym hall, Studio and Adventure Playground and this year will also be visiting a local retirement home regularly to share our learning, reading and singing. Our improvement plan this year looks at supporting Home learning. We have over 30 bags we have created that can be used at home to support children learning in the following areas Maths, language, Gaelic, STEM, Digital Safety, Health and Wellbeing and these have stories, games and hands on learning resources to support learning. Please see a member of staff if you are interested in taking a bag home. We will also be starting our home lending library where children can choose 4 books a month to take home.

Thanks for your continued support and as always we welcome your feedback and ideas to improve.

Please can we ask that if you are emailing the school you include your child's full name and class.
