<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Interpreting Song Lyrics</u></p> <p>Listen to 'The Climb' by Miley Cyrus https://youtu.be/NG2zyeVRchs</p> <p>TIP – you will need to replay it and listen a number of times.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> How does this song relate to moving onto another challenge/High School? What words or phrases from the lyrics show this? What key messages do you think this song shares with listeners? What lines/words/phrases show: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Motivation? Perseverance? Courage? Why do you think 'The Climb' is the focus and not the speed or what's on the other side? Do you agree that there is always going to be another mountain and an uphill battle? Why? What parts did you relate to? Why? 	<p>Can you log onto Nessy Spelling and work on your individual targets?</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Choose a way to further practise spelling your words.</p> <p>You may wish to try:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Spelling word jumble – cut strips of paper/card. Choose a word and write it out on a strip of paper, leaving a space between each letter. Then cut up the word between the letters. Jumble the pieces then rebuild the word as fast as you can. Repeat for your other words. <p>TIP: You may wish to write the words quite big.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>A Letter to my Future Self</u></p> <p>Write letter to your future high school self that you can put in an envelope to open at a later date of your choosing.</p> <p>Think about how you are feeling now about going to high school; things you are excited about or looking forward to or what you hope to achieve in secondary school.</p> <p>Some further questions to think about:</p> <p>What subjects do you think you will like the most? Are there teams/clubs you want to get involved in? Are you hoping to make new friends? What are you going to miss about primary school? What do you hope to have achieved by the time you read this letter? Is there any advice you would like to give your future self? What do you hope not to have forgotten or to have changed by the time you read this?</p> <p>Write your letter and pop it somewhere safe to read at a later date.</p>

Part 1: Teach someone the BODMAS rule

Teach someone at home or in your family via a phone/video call the BODMAS rule on the order of operations.

You could create and record an instructional video and share this.

Or you could make a poster explaining how to apply the rule and why.

Part 2: Applying BODMAS

Try these:

1. Put brackets in the correct places to make these correct.

$$9 - 3 \times 2 = 12$$

$$8 - 3 + 2 = 7$$

2. Use these number cards, +, -, x, ÷ and brackets to get the target answer.



Make your own BODMAS calculations for someone else to try. Include an answer sheet.

Motion Flip book Challenge

A Flip or flick book is a booklet (can be a mini book or sometimes drawn on the corner of a larger book) with a series of images that very gradually change from one page to the next. When the pages are viewed (flicked) in quick succession, the images appear to animate, showing motion.
