




Figure 4: Integrated teaching and learning approaches

Instead of directing children, and telling them what to do, the curiosity, inquiry approach is based on child-led learning. Therefore, children make their own choices, and figure things out for themselves which leads to enhanced confidence, critical thinking, collaboration and problem solving skills.
