Then, use your 5 digits to find out what is the largest number you can make, and then find out what is the smallest number you can make. Finally, try to find out how many numbers you can make using your 5 digits, and put your numbers in order from smallest to largest.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>The Brain House. Our brains are like houses, where we have an upstairs brain, and a downstairs brain. The little people living in our upstairs brain are our thinkers, they help us to create new things and to problem-solve. The little people living downstairs are our feelers, where they look out for danger and keep us safe. Draw a picture of your own brain house with an upstairs and downstairs, and then try to think of and label at least 3 little people for each floor (for example: Frightened Freddie might live downstairs, whereas Curious Cameron would live upstairs).</p>
